



# School & Community OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Hui No'eu is dedicated to co developing youth programs that provide in-depth knowledge, skills, and understanding of the visual arts to Maui schools and communities.

Studies have shown the many positive effects of an arts-rich learning environment on both students and teachers, such as higher job satisfaction for teachers and enhanced critical thinking and problem solving skills for students, along with the ability to make stronger, meaningful connections between academic disciplines, the outside world, and to everyday life.

The visual arts are *proven* to stimulate and enhance student performance in all curriculum areas and to encourage the development of improved self-image and empowerment. The visual arts can provide opportunities for:

- Imagination and creativity to flow
- Communication and problem-solving skills to grow
- Self-directed intrinsic motivation to be engendered
- Teamwork to be encouraged and appreciated
- Diverse thinking to take place
- Individuality to excel
- Positive self-expression to evolve

## FIELD TRIP (Free)

Classes & groups are welcome to visit the Hui, tour the latest exhibition and take a self-guided walking tour of the grounds any time during regular hours. (M - F, 10 AM - 4 PM). While it is not required, we recommend scheduling your visit to confirm exhibition installation or rentals do not conflict with your preferred dates. Call 572-6560 for information.

## EXPLORE & DISCOVER VISIT (\$7 per student & up)

Explore & Discover Visits are curated to fit your needs and can include guided exhibition discussions, walking tours of the historic estate and gardens, a picnic on the front lawn overlooking Haleakala and the West Maui Mountains, talks with curators, studio demos with artists, and hands-on visual arts workshops in our professionally equipped artist studios.

Fees begin at \$7-\$10 per student per workshop hour with a 15 student maximum per classroom. *Scheduling subject to teaching space and staff availability. 1 adult chaperone is required for every 8 students. Waiver forms required for each student under age 18.*

Sample itinerary:

10:00 AM:	Tour of current exhibition
10:30 AM:	Hands-on visual arts workshop
11:30 PM:	Self-guided walking tour of full estate
12:00 PM:	Picnic lunch on the front lawn

## WORKSHOP SEQUENCE (Matching funds available)

Transform arts exposure into arts education by bringing your class or group to the Hui for a five, eight or ten week workshop. Weekly meetings ensure students gain from a cumulative arts learning experience that taps into their creative spirits, increases confidence, team building and time management skills, and enhances academic skills delivered via participation in the visual arts. ## ARTIST RESIDENCY (Matching funds available)

Artist residencies are designed to place Hui teaching artists into school and community settings where they can share the myriad benefits of their creative processes. Each residency is a custom-designed collaboration between the host site and the teaching artist requiring ongoing communication regarding the intent of the project and how to tie the art form into a specific school program. Residencies may range from 5 weeks to full semesters.
